CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK - "COMMUNITIES OF FAITH & RESILIENCE"

Life for us has changed so much in the past year that it is not recognisable, comfortable or easy. This week, our church community will reflect upon this years C.S.W theme - how Catholic schools are communities of faith and resilience and the powerful role they have in the lives of many young people.

They are a source of comfort, belonging and strength. In them we are called to support each other. In them, we are inspired by the belief that God has created us with a capacity to give and receive love. This love is bound in faith and is more resilient than any virus. It is so very important that students return to school, not simply to get back into academic life, but more importantly, to reconnect with teachers and friends - to experience community. This week at Mass - we join with the schools and students as we focus on faith, hope and love - while acknowledging the challenges that we all face at this present time and the need for us all to feel a sense of belonging in our community again.

MONDAY: Catholic Schools - Communities of *FAITH*

A Catholic school is a special community where we learn about God's love for us and the way Jesus teaches us to live. We learn to show God's love to others by being kind in our thoughts, words and actions.

TUESDAY: Catholic Schools - Communities of *LEARNING*

We learn many things in school - maths, Gaeilge, science, music and art. But we also learn how to be a good friend. WE learn to be helpful and kind. Jesus' golden rule is to treat others as you would like to be treated. Today we learn to be the best we can be, being kind to ourselves, others and the world around us.

WEDNESDAY: Catholic Schools - Communities of *LOVE*

Today we think of our school as a community of love. We especially think of our grandparents. They can be very important teachers who show us love, how to be caring and how to share. They can teach us about the past and about the importance of working hard and doing our best. In our Catholic school we try to show that love each day in kind thoughts, kind words and kind actions.

THURSDAY: Catholic Schools - Communities of *RESILIENCE*

Resilience means how we cope with things even when they get tough. Sometimes we feel sad or worried about something. God wants us to be safe and happy. We can pray and talk to God about our worries. We can learn ways to help with worries. A Catholic school is a place where everyone wants you to feel safe and happy - you will never be alone, and will always be cared for.

FRIDAY: Catholic Schools - Communities of *HOPE*

As Catholic Schools week comes to a close we think of our school as a Community of Hope. We are all children of God, called to live like Jesus asked us. We will continue to make school a place where everyone feels safe, welcome and cared for. We live in the hope that Jesus has shown us the way to live and we hope to create a future where all people can know God's love.
